

At Jackson Clark, she has led community engagement and collaborative initiatives resulting in Pittsburgh's largest federal grant award (\$30 million) for the neighborhood of Larimer via HUD's Choice Neighborhoods program; facilitated Pittsburgh's first-ever plan for making the region a more welcoming place for immigrants and refugees via Mayor Peduto's *Welcoming Pittsburgh Plan*; and was lead facilitator and planner for the One Northside initiative, Pittsburgh's largest multiple neighborhood resident-driven collaborative community plan including all 18 neighborhoods of the Northside.

Prior to founding Jackson/Clark, Traci was the Director of Business Development at Bally Design, a product and exhibit development firm and Marketing Communications Specialist at RedZone Robotics.

Traci founded several arts-and-culture initiatives that are recognized for playing an important role in the redevelopment of Pittsburgh including the Ground Zero Action Network, Green Mannequin Productions and FLUX—a multi-disciplinary, multi-neighborhood event celebrating artists and communities, spanning 15 events over 8 years. Her work was recently included in the permanent archives of the Senator John Heinz History Center, she has been named one of the *Top 50 Creative Forces in Pittsburgh* by the *Pittsburgh Post Gazette* and was one of Pittsburgh's early *40 Under 40* award recipients.

Traci is a graduate of Carnegie Mellon University and resides in the Southside Slopes of Pittsburgh.
